

MACRO QUEST Photo Game

Parents - You're up... Locate an item in a room and zoom in for a close-up! You'll want to make the item fill the frame as you zoom in as much as possible. That's macrophotography! Be sure whatever item you choose is in a safe zone for your questors. Find multiple items for an extra challenge.

Once you got the shot, show them & send them on their quest! Make sure they're correct by having them take their own creative photo similar to the one you took. Depending on the difficulty, you could leave hints or tell a story about your photo.

Now switch roles and let them create a quest for you!

RULE OF THIRDS Photo Challenge

Let's take a walk! For this challenge, find something interesting to photograph. In this photo you'll want one large subject to be the focus. It could be a house, a parked car, a tall tree... or this picnic table we found. You can choose!

First, focus on your subject in the center of the frame. Now, take the photo. This will be your reference photo.

Next, divide your photo into thirds top to bottom & side to side (in your head) & retake the photo with the subject located at one of the intersecting points... left & top third, left & bottom, etc. Play with it and see what looks most appealing.

Study your photos and see what looks best to you! Go on another adventure and find something new to photograph using this rule of thirds.









10 Tips to Better Pics - Tip #2

Fill Flash - When you use the camera on your cell phone, your flash is probably on Auto. Then when you take a photo of someone on a bright sunny day or with a lot of snow on the ground... your camera thinks there is plenty of light so it doesn't fire the flash. You now have a photo with shadows where you don't want them like on your subjects face. Before you retake the photo, turn your flash to the 'ON' position to use it as a source of light to fill those shadows . . . you are now using Fill Flash!
