Curriculum & program information was shared at the individual Family Connection Meetings a few weeks ago.

Please join us on **Thursday, Sept. 19**th at 7:20 for Principal Remarks and PTSA General Meeting in the gym.

Last week, we had our first safety drill of the year. Each month, we conduct a drill to prepare for unexpected events such as earthquakes, police activity in the area, wildlife, or an intruder. Descriptions of each type of drill can be found here. Our staff is trained in each procedure and in in ways to use age-appropriate language when discussing the purpose of each drill. The main thing we emphasize is listening to school staff and following their directions during any emergency. In a future newsletter, I will share our protocol for student reunification if we ever have a disaster or mid-day snowstorm that causes major transportation issues. The important thing to know is that we will keep your child safe until you or someone from their emergency contact list can get here. Please keep all contact information up-to-date.

SHARING TABLE PROCEDURES



District Sharing Table Procedures

A sharing table is a place to collect unopened, safe food and beverages that have not been consumed by one student and made available for another students to select. Using sharing tables is an innovative strategy to encourage the consumption of nutritious foods and reduce food waste in our district.

School cafeterias are carefully monitored by health and safety regulations to ensure student safety from food borne illnesses. Implementing a share table must be carefully regulated to ensure the safety of our students. A written procedure is provided below to ensure food safety and Health Code compliance is maintained if a school chooses to begin a sharing table.

Procedure:

- Adult in cafeteria should oversee the sharing table during lunch to educate students on proper usage and monitor items being placed on the table. Items placed on the table cannot be open, punctured, or otherwise compromised. The monitor may invite students to participate as sharing table helpers, teaching them about the importance of food safety and sustainability.
- Foods that are not authorized for sharing must be discarded. These items include: Unpackaged items such as salads or hot entrees, and packaged items that have been opened.
- Foods that can be shared: Whole fruit with a peel, unopened milk, yogurt, cheese, juice, and canned fruit, and sealed, packaged products such as crackers, and craisins.
- Items placed on the sharing tables are available only for use by students in the cafeteria.
 All items on the sharing table must be consumed in the cafeteria.
- Any items left on the sharing table at the end of each meal service should be inspected and washed by the monitor for re-use. No items from home will be brought back into Kitchen inventory.

The Food and Nutrition Services Department works closely with the health department. If questions arise please reach out to Food and Nutrition Services.
